Service Provided

Each Stand Down is a collaborative effort among hundreds of caring volunteers & professionals who give of their time to fulfill our mission. At each Stand Down event, the following services are provided.

- Hot lunch
- Bag lunch to go
- Personal care (hair cuts, personal care supplies, clothing)
- Health care screening (HIV/ AIDS, TB, Hepatitis C, etc.)
- Eye and Dental care
- Health care services
- VA Benefit counseling
- General Benefits i.e. Social Security
- Substance abuse counseling
- Mental health counseling
- Legal Services
- Employment Services
- Housing Services (referrals to housing programs"
- Spiritual Services
- Picture ID Services
- Activities to empower the Homeless Veterans
